

## Challenges (I)

Certain challenges characterize our era, such as:

- 1. Democratization of nations & transition to free market economies and the need for privatization of land & re, housing & enterprises and for registration
- 2. Rapid urbanization due to political & climate migration informal development and the need for good governance & formalization
- 3. Climate change and the need for adaptation and mitigation measures





## Challenges (II)

- 4. Economic globalization & sustainable prosperity for all and the need for reforms and harmonization of policies and legislation
- 5. Economic crisis and the urgent need for development & poverty reduction
- 6. The hope for more democracy, transparency & peace and the need for citizen awareness, citizen participation and public support to the reforms



#### 1. Democratization & Transition to free market

Development projects, infrastructure, landuse & planning reforms require land takings and rearrangement of rights

- spatial information & cadastre (for transparent decision making, management & implementation)





Population: ~900M Land area: 27,381,300 km<sup>2</sup> Properties: ~300M








# 2. Political + climate migration, rapid urbanization, informal development: the need for good governance





Make good use of all available information, crowd sourcing, VGI

#### BIM: owners/operators, engineers, surveyors, architects, designers



At its simplest level, BIM provides a common environment for all information defining a building, facility or asset together with its common parts and activities. This including building shape, design and construction time, costs, physical performance, logistics and more.



# Access to land, adequate housing and property rights is a fundamental human right



>50M people in greater Europe live in informal settlements

> on-going legalization projects-property titles; city planning reforms

# Negative environmental and food security impacts

- Use of large parts of forested land for the production of bio-fuels
- Dedication of large areas of fertile land in a country to the production of food for another country
- The unplanned expansion of urban areas on agricultural land or ecologically fragile areas (UN-HABITAT)

- One of the more notable things about foreclosure is that the rules and procedures differ in the various jurisdictions









### 5. The economic crisis & the need for development

- Computerization: big <u>time-saver</u>
- Reducing average <u>time and cost</u> for property transactions
- Easing access to the registry
- Implementation of NSDIs
- Easing construction permits
- Reducing labor costs









### The growing housing "affordability" problem

# Significant barriers to "affordable" housing:

- High and complex zoning + building restrictions (limited supply)
- uncertain timeframes
- property taxation

- There is a growing number of low-income workers who constitute a "demand" but those who control the market see no profit in housing them






# MDGs report: Gains were significant before the crisis

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




- Foreclosures have become a very real and almost daily occurrence in many cities.

- Home owners can find themselves unable to sell their property because its value is too high, or in possession of a home that has lost its value.








## The hope for more democracy, transparency and peace: Creative Participation versus Violence
